**TERRY LYNN HUEY CHARGED WITH MURDER FOR BRANSON  
STABBING**

FORSYTH, MO - Taney County Prosecuting Attorney, Jeffrey M. Merrell announced today that TERRY LYNN HUEY, DOB: 12/26/1954 has been charged with one (1) count of the class A felony of murder in the second degree, one (1) count of the unclassified felony of armed criminal action and one (1) count of the class D felony of unlawful use of a weapon. These charges arise from a July 19<sup>th</sup> incident in Branson, Missouri at the Crescent Court Motel where DEWAYNE LYNN was stabbed in the shoulder and chest area. DEWAYNE LYNN later died from the injuries. Taney County Prosecuting Attorney, Jeffrey M. Merrell has requested a \$500,000 bond in connection with the filing of these charges.

The class A felony of murder in the second degree carries with it a range of punishment of ten (10) to thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment in the Department of Corrections. The unclassified felony of armed criminal action has a minimum punishment of three (3) years and no defined maximum. The class D felony of unlawful use of a weapon carries with it the range of punishment of one (1) day to one (1) year in the County Jail, or one (1) year to four (4) years in the Department of Corrections, and/or a fine not to exceed \$5,000.

Please be advised that the charges filed against the defendant is merely an accusation and the defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
